Dear friends and supporters of Southern Sudan Mission,

Greetings in the name of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Pictured are a few of the 600 orphans around the newly constructed House of Prayer (church building) at the new mission compound near the South Sudanese Orphans Compound. Upon completing the House of Prayer, benches and a podium were ordered. When they are received, the brethren will begin holding worship assemblies at the facility.

Chan has begun construction on a preacher's house in the compound. Upon completion of the house, we will move a preacher to the compound to help guard the building, building materials, etc. from thieves. Upon completion of the preacher's



house, work will begin to construct classrooms for the children. Hopefully when the classrooms are complete, we will have trained brethren to live at the compound to teach the children. Chan said there is a great amount of excitement among the workers and children. The water drilling professionals are still seeking a good location for the well. Hopefully we will have a positive report from them in a few days. Yes, I know it is moving slower than we wish, but the companies work on their own time.

James reports the School of Biblical Studies is going very well. He is excited about the desire of the students to learn. He also said the students are required to knock doors a couple of days a week in addition to their classroom instruction. This will increase their ability to reach out to the lost when they return to their respective congregations.

Unfortunately, there was another outbreak of violence between the Anuak and Nuer. Several Anuak Tribesmen attacked and killed ten Nuer Tribesmen. Our two Anuak students had returned home for the weekend and cannot return to the compound until the problem is solved. When situations like this occur, the Ethiopian Military requires everyone to stay in their homes until they deal with the problem (find the guilty Anuak Tribesman and kill them). Please keep all the students in your prayers, particularly the Anuaks as they will be threatened for attending class at our Nuer compound with Nuer Students.

Lord willing, I will be departing for Ethiopia in October. I will teach the Level One Students in the School of Biblical Studies for several days. I will also spend several

days with some of the graduates discussing their work and attempting to answer questions they may have. Hopefully, Brother Colin Chandler from Portales, NM and possibly Brother Buddy Faulkenberry from Temple, TX (both Board Members) will join me a little later. They will check the water wells and do maintenance work at a couple of the compounds. The three of us, accompanied by Brother James, the Director of the work, and an Ethiopian Military Guard plan to travel to Nyinenyang, a city between Gambella and the South Sudan Border to evaluate the possibility of moving a branch of the School of Biblical Studies there. If it is feasible, it would be extremely beneficial as many students from South Sudan could attend the classes. Presently, a student from South Sudan must travel two or three days to get to the campus in the city of Gambella.

Brother James reported the corn has been harvested, shucked, and sacked. A couple of brethren will take 45 bags with 50 Kilos (100+ pounds each) to the brethren hidden in the bush (forest) in South Sudan. One bag of corn will usually feed a family of 6 for a month. The brethren will travel by foot with trailers pulled by donkeys into troubled areas to deliver the corn. If the rebels spot them, they will take the corn and probably kill the brethren. Please keep this effort in your prayers.



I want to thank the brethren at each congregation and each individual that partners with Southern Sudan Mission for the furtherance of the gospel to the Sudanese in refugees' camps in Ethiopia and villages in Ethiopia and South Sudan. Never forget you are as important to the mission as we are. We cannot go without your financial support.
